It was amazing to hear the rich vocabulary that our year ones expressed so eloquently and their smiling faces showed how much they enjoyed their performance. T4W uses spoken language to develop writing skills. Quality writing evolves from first expanding oral language skills and then explicitly teaching the construction of a sentence, paragraph and text

At Yale we are proud to be a T4W school

"In Talk For Writing, the process of "Imitation – Innovation – Invention" is explored. Students learn to orally recite and act out popular stories through listening and reading. The teacher maps out the story using pictures to aid students' memory. The repetition allows the students to interact with the text and helps them to internalise the language patterns and text features. Students are then taught to use the underlying structure of the original text to create their own version on a different topic. Over time, they move towards independent writing as they create texts about their own topics." DSF - Talk for Writing


National Sorry Day
