


OPEN NIGHT





Responsible is about being dependable, keeping promises and honouring our commitments. It is accepting the consequences for what we say and do.

Being your best is striving toward your goals to the best of your abilities.



Have you ever wanted to know how to make playdough? Follow A3's instructions and you will be able to make your own playdough!



How to Make Playdough

Ingredients

- Half a cup of flour
- 2 spoons of salt
- Half a spoon of cream of tartar
- 1 spoon of oil
- 1/4 cup of warm water
- 4 drops of food colouring



Steps

1. Add flour, salt and cream of tartar to a mixing bowl.
2. Pour in the oil and water and mix all the ingredients together until they form a dough ball.
3. Make a hole in the middle of the ball to pour your food dye into.
4. Knead the dough until the dye is thoroughly mixed.
