

#### NEWS AROUND THE SCHOOL



Dear Parents and Caregivers,

This year, the PBS committee made a change to the PBS medallion system.

Up until now, the old system involved students gaining up to 10 weekly points for their behaviour over their whole primary school lifetime and receiving a medallion at certain set stages (Bronze medallion at 420 points, silver at 840), which for some students can be years apart.

The new system is run on a yearly basis with the students points being reset at the start of each year. As soon as the student achieves the required points for each stage, they are awarded that certificate (Buzzy) at the following assembly. This means there are more certificates awarded at more assemblies more often. This in turn makes positive behaviour and the PBS system more visible and celebrated at Yale Primary School. It also allows students who may have had not such a good year, to start fresh the following year. Finally the weekly points will be out of 5 instead of 10, with a maximum of 200 points to be earned in one year.

Award Points

Bronze Buzzy 50

Silver Buzzy 105

Gold Buzzy 165

YPS positive behaviour medal Top 2

The certificates were made as a practical decision, with regards to the amount to be handed out. The top 2 students of every class will receive a special 'PBS Medal' at the End of Year Concert.

The phase in for the new system began with the 1-4s in 2022, and the 5-6s finishing up on the old system.

Online Absence

Great News! You can now report your child's absence in another new and easy way. The Yale Primary School website now has a dark red button at the top right hand side of the homepage called, "Online Absence" (see attached screenshot). Save the Yale Primary school website as a favourite in your web browser for easy access to reporting your child's absence. Please remember to report EVERY absence to the office or your child's teacher, before 9.55am.

Mrs Churchill wrote in the recent Term 4 Issue 1 Newsletter, "If your child arrives at school after 8.50am but before 9.55am they will be marked as L, which is the code name for late. If your child arrives at school after 9.55am they will be recorded as a U, which is the code name for unexplained. It is imperative that you notify the office or class teacher when your child is late to school with an explanation as to why your child was not at school on time. This information can then be entered into the system. Arrivals after 9.55am will be reflected in the students' attendance data in their school report as number of half days absent."

Here are all of the ways which you can report your child's absence:

- "Connect" absences
- Calling the office- 9232 3500
- Talk to your child's teacher
- Respond to absence text message
- Now through the Yale Primary School website
