MESSAGE FROM PRINCIPAL GLEN READ

Dear Parents and Carers

School is in full swing now and the majority of our students have arrived at school and enrolled and well settled in to their classrooms routines. I would like to commend our students for the way they have commenced the school year and for the way they have knuckled down, and are working hard. Overall the behaviour of the Yale Primary School students has been excellent and I haven't had to talk to any student about inappropriate behaviour. Well done students and thank you teachers.

This year the Department of Education has launched a Quality Teacher Strategy (QTS) for use by all Western Australian public schools, and sets out the systems commitment to improving quality teaching across the state, to deliver effective teaching to all public schools. QTS, The Phonics Initiative, is one part of the approach to quality teaching. All students in Year One across the state will be assessed in Term 3, 2023 in regard to their proficiency in phonics.

Progress of the replacement building at the school.

Mr Melling, Mrs Lawrie and I met a week ago with the Department of Finance, Department of Education to discuss where the new building plans were up to, to replace the building we lost in the fire. At this point in time I have been told the new building will begin in July which will mean that the builder will most likely be using the front staff car park as a site office. This will then lead to a part of the staff car park being fenced off. The way parents move around the school will most likely change for safety reasons.

Crossing the Staff Car Park.

I would like to ask parents **to stop using** the staff car park as a thoroughfare and I would like them to use the paths to walk around the staff car park. Several staff cars have sustained damage as parents move in between the cars, and through the car park. Students should also not be walking through the staff car park to avoid being hit by moving vehicles.



IMPORTANT SCIENCE ROOM SAFETY INFORMATION

Dear Parents

There are number of regulation and requirements related to Safety of the Student in a Science Teaching Laboratory as we have at Yale PS. Having a dedicated science laboratory teaching room in primary schools is a relatively new phenomenon so the guidelines are still being modified for the primary school. However, tried and tested guidelines are followed.

The students have been taught the **Safety Rules** and are reminded throughout the school year. Department of Education protocols are adhered to, this includes hand wash and gel, equipment spray with antiseptic for desks and bench surfaces.

We thought you would like to know some of the needs for a safe learning environment for your child and that they are adhered to.

The physical safety needs related to fire, chemical, water, electricity, the handling of animals and gardening at primary school level are as necessary at primary level as they are at high school level. We have standard protocols and equipment installed, for example, fire blankets, fire extinguishers, buckets of sand, eye flush hoses and first aid ice etc.

No running or throwing - commonsense rules in any classroom.

Gardening gloves are used in the garden and face-masks if we are using potting mix and manure in the bedding stages. Children are taught to use equipment such as shovels, trowels, gardening forks and hoes correctly and safely.

Mixing chemicals we only use kitchen level chemicals, plastic gloves and eye protection are worn, handling of glass containers is taught and adhered to.

Gloves are used when handling earthworm materials, changing water in tanks, feeding and watering butterflies, chicks or any other animal that is being observed from time to time in the science room. Hands are washed immediately after all these activities.

Correct safety protocols are taught and followed when using power tools, saws, hammers, craft knives, screw drives and other basic construction materials.


Basic closed footwear must be worn when in the science room. Long hair and fringes need to be tied up or secured in a hair net to stop the hair falling over a students face which may prevent clear, unobscured vision when touching mixtures, tools, electrical circuitry (batteries only) or with animal enclosures that they maybe working with. Loose flowing clothing or jewellery also needs to be contained.

These regulations are **not negotiable**, as they are needed for the safety of your child and others in the class. It would be disappointing for your child if they had to sit and observe rather than participate.

There have been very few incidents at our school that fall in breach of the regulations, and the occasions have been quietly and amicably resolved, but we thought you would like to know that we take Science room safety seriously. The following is the Draft Advice for Primary Schools from the Education Department of Western Australia

Lessons use a variety of strategies and topics aligned to the Australian Curriculum. These include individual and group tasks, collection of data over a period of time either individually or as a team member. A variety of written and illustrated genre are used to allow students to demonstrate their understanding of skills and concepts being presented such as, flow charts, detailed labelled diagrams and report writing. All students are expected to complete all set work within a timely framework and to the best of their ability.

Sometimes students will need to collect data after school and over the weekend particularly if they are involved with Science Talent Search, PEAC or personal projects with my supervision. Familial and parental input is welcome! If you have a relative that would like to speak to our students in a specialist science area – please speak with me, or Glen Read (Principal)



A gold coin donation is all that is required to join the P&C and be able to vote.


