MESSAGE FROM PRINCIPAL GLEN READ

Dear Parents

For some time now I have noticed that there is pattern emerging that some parents are leaving students in the front office or outside the front office for long periods of time once the end of school bell has rung, instead of picking their child up when school finishes at 3pm.

School finishes at 3pm and the majority of students have left the school by 3.15pm, but we do have some students whose parents are repeatedly leaving students in the office, sometimes until as late as 3.45 pm. This is not acceptable, and I would ask parents to make other care arrangements if it is not possible for you to pick your child up by 3pm.

Ms Kristal McGlew, A local and extremely talented artist has spent countless hours creating a new mural wall for Yale Primary School.


This 20 metre wall boasts large scaled, intricately detailed portraits of Australian fauna and flora against an array of colour that makes the pieces

HAVE YOU GOT ON BOARD WITH COMPASS YET?

Did you know that when you use Compass you can:
• Give permission for excursions and incursions
• Keep up to date with your children's class events and news

• Access your child/children's reports using Compass?

If you're having any difficulty accessing Compass, Yale's school-parent portal, please contact the office on 9232 3500 or drop in to talk to our friendly school officers. See below for some of our regular Compass FAQs.



Where can I access my child's reports?

Access and download your student's reports with ease. Simply:

- 1. Login to your school's Compass Portal.
- 2. Select the View Academic Reports option below your student's name. This should redirect you to a page showing all progress and semester reports available.
- 3. Select the name of the report you are interested in viewing, and this should automatically begin the download process



Friendly Note: if your child has since left/graduated from school, you won't be able to access their reports through Compass, and will instead need to follow-up with the school.

How do I pay for an excursion on Compass?

Make snappy, online payments in minutes with our online platform. Simply:

- 1. Login to your Compass portal (mobile app or web), and view your home page. When an excursion requires consent/payment, a notification will appear here.
- 2. Click on this link to be redirected to your Action Centre, where all upcoming events/excursions requiring parental/guardian action will automatically display.
- 3. Click anywhere on the desired event's line to open the consent/payment section.
- 4. Fill in the fields provided. To pay specifically, select saved credit card details from the dropdown menu available, or add a new credit via the 'New Credit Card' option.
- 5. Once completed, select Proceed, to submit your payment for processing.

Friendly Note: Currently, only VISA or MasterCard payments are accepted by Compass. Alternative payment options may be available at your school's general office.



Where do I see the payments I've made through Compass?

View in-Compass payments, in three simple steps:

- 1. Login to Compass
- 2. Select the Cog Icon in the top right hand corner of your page.
- 3. Select the My Payments option, and review your payment history.







Our Before, After School and Holiday programs are designed to support school communities and busy families. We provide an engaging and educational environment for children to form friendships, learn life skills and prepare them for life beyond the classroom.

The changes to CCS will provide up to 50% off feed. This means even more families can access quality programs such as our 'Rise then Shine' before school program, 'Stay and Play' after school program, and our Ultimate Playdate School Holiday programs at a very affordable rate.

All of our 460° services across Australia are registered and approved by the Australian Government to ensure parents at our services can access CCS.

In most cases, you don't need to do anything to get the increased rate. If you get CCS, changes to your CCS will be automatically applied from 10 July 2023.

What if I don't currently get CCS and want to apply?

If your family earns under \$530,000 and meets the following requirements, you'll get an increased Child Care Subsidy (CCS) from 10 July 2023.

You or your partner must meet all of the following:

- care for your child at least 2 nights per fortnigh or have 14% care
- are liable for fees for care provided at an approved child care service. Every centre we run across Australia is registered and approved by the Australian Covernment
- meet the residence rules.

Your child must also meet both of these:

- immunisation requirements
- not be attending secondary school unless an exemption applies.
